Introduction

Programmes follow the Governance Certificate or Advanced Certificate course in their academic application. This responsibility falls to the chair of the board, non-executive and executive directors, the support officers and managers. These courses teach the principles of good governance to individuals for the benefit and application of participating organisations.

The Certificate

It is suitable for those without a formal qualification in governance whether a new board member, charity trustee or company secretary. It will be equally useful to those with professional qualifications but little or no practical experience of corporate governance. Accreditation

Assessment

The Governance Certificate Course is assessed with a mixed question style examination paper and a case study essay question which forms the second part of the exam. A pass mark of 60% is expected for those wishing to achieve the certificate. Participants can opt out of the assessment and by doing so, will be awarded a certificate of attendance identifying the areas that they have covered on the course.

The Advanced Certificate Course is assessed using a series of reflective logs, coupled with a final reflective assignment ensuring the participant can competently translate key principles of theory to practice.
